1. How does the mocking of Jesus in John 19:1-3 reveal the depths of human sin and rebellion against God?
2. What significance does Pilate's question, "Behold the man!" (John 19:5), hold in the context of Jesus' crucifixion?
3. How does Jesus' willingness to carry His own cross (John 19:17-22) illustrate His humility and obedience to God's will?
4. What do the divided garments and the intact tunic (John 19:23-24) signify about Jesus' humanity and deity?
5. How do the people at the foot of the cross (John 19:25-27) represent the human and divine aspects of Jesus' nature?
6. What does Jesus' cry of "It is finished!" (John 19:30) convey about the completion of His redemptive work?
7. What are the theological and spiritual truths that are indicated with the blood and the water (John 19:34-37) flowing from Jesus' side after the soldier pierced him?
8. What do we learn about Joseph of Arimathea and Nicodemus' (John 18:38-42) actions after the death of Jesus? What should we learn from their boldness of belief?
